On the face of it today's parable might look like a tale of an angry God punishing a faithless person.

When a property owner leaves for a time and entrusts his property to three servants. He entrusts them with an enormous amount of money. Scholars differ as to the modern figure but safe to say we are talking about many year's wages, perhaps as many as 15-20 year's wages. Many many hundreds of thousands of dollars, perhaps even millions. An enormous blessing and responsibility. What would you do in their position? If you were entrusted with that kind of money on behalf of someone else? Would you risk it in trying to make him some more....or would you play it safe? In the parable it is the one who takes the safest approach who is punished. Never mind the fact that burying riches in the ground was at the time, a common method for keeping valuables safe.

Despite the fact that the return on investments, both then and now, is not always profitable or predictable, the master calls the two who risk the fortune on the markets, "good" and "trustworthy," while the one who hides the treasure safely away is called wicked and lazy. Not only that but he is thrown into the outer darkness where there is weeping and gnashing of teeth. Wow! Its not like he lost it all.

This parable, however; reveals a God who is much more gracious than vengeful because the story pivots not on notions of risk and reward, nor even simply on the wise stewardship of resources ......there is more at stake here. This parable pivots on the idea of relationship and mutual trust, and perhaps the treasure that has been entrusted to us is the kingdom itself!
