So why is it that two such great Saints are celebrated on the same day when so many other, perhaps more obscure, saints get a whole day to themselves? Well, we don't celebrate them together because of their similarities! On the contrary, they had quite different backgrounds and personalities, they came to be followers of Christ in different ways and they sometimes had marked differences of opinion about what it meant to be a Christian.

During the course of their different ministries Peter and Paul did not always get along. There was definitely some tension between them. The Jewish-born Christians based in Jerusalem, which included Peter, had some real concerns about all the gentiles and their non-Jewish practices that Paul's efforts were bringing into the church. There may well have been a residual element of suspicion attached to Paul's earlier persecution of the church or even a sense of superiority on the part of the Jerusalem church that they had known and followed Jesus prior to his crucifixion – one certainly gets a sense from some of Paul's letters that he is quite defensive about his late-calling to be an apostle. In one of his letters Paul actually tells us that he opposed Peter 'face to face' about whether Jewish food laws applied to Christians – in other words they probably had a stand up row about what it meant to be a Christian

But, and this is the *really* important part, *despite* these differences in character and outlook they ultimately recognised each other as both following the same Christ, they met together in a spirit of compromise at the Council of Jerusalem to find a solution to their differences and they are now known as 'the pillars of the church'.
