THE ROAD LESS TRAVELLED

Two roads diverged in a wood, and I—
I took the one less travelled by,
And that has made all the difference. (Robert Frost)

Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵ For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. ²⁶ For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? (Matthew 16.24-26)

This is such a counter-cultural message for our time. Our society is characterised not by self denial but by self indulgence. Thousands of advertisements each day, and tribes of 'influencers', tell us that life is all about 'you' and their subliminal message is that the more you consume, the better home or car or clothes you have, the more holidays or experiences you have – the happier and more fulfilled you will be. These messages infiltrate our thinking and yet, at the same time, we know that many in our consumer society are chronically unhappy and that problems associated with a lack of fulfilment in life – such as depression and addiction – are a growing cause for concern in all Western societies.

Jesus offers the world (and each of us) a different way. Rather than self-indulgence he invites us to follow him and learn from him. It's the road less travelled, but choosing it makes all the difference.

The Archbishop has accepted the nomination of Rev Jo Smith as the Parish Priest of Modbury and Golden Grove. Her commissioning will be held on Saturday, 14th October at 2.00 pm at St. Luke's church.
