Shopping for Truth: Australian attitudes to Faith today.

In our culture most people think that no one religion is better than any other and that it is offensive to say that you have a claim on truth. Where does that leave us who have a gospel to proclaim, with faith, certainties, and confidence in grand religious propositions? Is evangelism even possible in our culture?

Robin Hood's band of resistance fighters, known colloquially as Merry Men, is perhaps not a bad image for the church today. They live under an oppressive regime, but they can smile and laugh because they know that the present system is not the last word. They know that the true king is coming, and that things will one day be different. From time to time, they still remind the false powers that their rule is temporary and bogus, by acts of rebellion which recall the true king. They also whisper around the good news that things don't have to be like this. The king is coming, in fact he has already landed and others can begin to live joyfully in the light of this coming kingdom as well.

This is essentially what evangelism is-the simple announcement that there is another king, another kingdom that will one day become fully visible, and the invitation to take part in it.

In a letter to clergy, Archbishop Geoff Smith announced that he has received the resignation of Bishop Denise Ferguson as an assistant bishop in the Diocese. Bishop Denise will be retiring to Brisbane to be close to family. Bishop Denise will finish ministry in the Diocese on July 20 and conclude as assistant bishop early in September following Long Service Leave. We will farewell Bishop Denise and Mark at a service at the Cathedral on July 20 commencing at 10am.
